

Massachusetts, enlisted in the summer of 1775 for eight months, and served as a private under Captain Wood and Colonel Prescott, and was at the battle of Bunker Hill; and that after this service, he again enlisted for three years, no details of service given.

Her claim was not allowed, as she failed to furnish satisfactory proof of service as required by the pension laws. She died August 30, 1844.
