Madam:

I have to advise you that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim R. 4171 it appears that Joseph Grace was born April 6, 1758 in Newburyport, Massachusetts or Wilmington, Middlesex County, Massachusetts.

Soldier while living in Chelsea, Middlesex County, Massachusetts, married April 30, 1780 at Chelsea, Massachusetts, Mara Sargeant born October 9, 1763. He died September 7, 1823 in Springfield, Massachusetts.

His widow, Mara, while a resident of Springfield Township, Bradford County, Pennsylvania applied for pension December 4, 1838 and stated that while soldier was a resident of Reading, Massachusetts or Wilmington, Massachusetts he enlisted in the summer of 1775 for eight months and served as a private under Captain Wood and Colonel Prescott and was at the battle of Bunker Hill and that after this service he again enlisted for three
