The Certificate of the Secretary of War presented by you in the case of Maria Gruee widow of Joseph Gruee being a duplicate only of one filed by you in April 1845, of course afford no additional evidence of her husband's service. You are referred to my letter addressed to you on 27 May 1845 for the decision of this Department respecting the service ~~claimed~~ to be the Secretary of War.

No additional evidence has appeared in ~~the~~ the case of Mary Henshaw widow of William Henshaw since my letter to you of 23<sup>rd</sup> June 1845. The certificate of the Secretary of Massachusetts of the 10 May 1845 embraced all the service of William Henshaw contained in his Certificate of 10 July 1843.
