

Application for certificate of Revolutionary services
made by the Attorney of the party who rendered the service.

State of Massachusetts, County of
Suffolk and City of Boston.

The Secretary of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
is hereby requested to furnish evidence from the Rolls
in his office of the services of Joseph Groce in the
war of the Revolution.

He first enlisted from Boston in said County of Suffolk
in the year 1775 for the eight months service. He again enlist-
ed for the term of three years, and as is believed, from the town
of Wilmington, in Middlesex County, where he resided with
a Mr Butterfield, and received an honorable discharge.
A portion of this time he served in a uniform company,
and a portion, it is thought, as a Grenadier. The above
are all the particulars known of him.

Witness my hand this twenty ninth day of October
in the year of our Lord, 1846.
