The service of Joseph Grace as shown by the Certificate of the Secretary of Massachusetts corresponds in no respect either with the original declaration of Mrs Grace, or with her application to the Secretary for his Certificate, and the proof, identifying her husband as the Soldier from Wilmington, whose service under Capt Brad, and Lieutenant Sullivan in 1776 and 1778, must be very clear and satisfactory before she will be allowed the benefit of that service.
