I hereby Certify, That, from an examination of the Books and Documents, relating to Military Services in the War of the Revolution, which remain in this Department, it appears that the name of Joseph Grace is signed with a number of others, to an engagement to equip and hold themselves ready to march at a minute's warning, and to remain in the service of the United States for the term of three months; dated Wilmington, Nov^r. 29, 1776; — and upon a pay Roll of the comp^y. Commanded by the late Captⁿ Samuel Ward, in Col. Jonathan Cogswell's regt. detached for the purpose of guarding and fortifying the forts in and near Boston, agreeably to a Resolve of Sept. 30, 1778 — as a private from Oct. 3 to Dec. 31, including allowance for travel, 3 months; the roll was sworn to by Lieut. John Gulliver, commanding after the decease of Capt. Ward, Jan^y. 5th. 1779. The preceding is all the evidence of Service of any one of the name shown by any of the records in this office.
